The CJHP June 2007 issue is a great opportunity for students to their publish their works. Part of the issue will be dedicated to student papers. See the Call for Manuscripts at our [website](#). The CJHP will be sponsoring writing workshops for graduate students in California for this issue. The manuscript submission and peer-review processes are discussed, and graduate students (or recent graduates) are given the opportunity to bring to the workshop their works-in-progress. Editors review the materials and provide feedback. Also, helpful advice is provided to increase the chances of having a manuscript accepted for publication. Co-sponsoring universities are expected to provide either a room with large workspaces or a computer lab for manuscript editing. A computer with projector will be needed for demonstration and presentations.

The 81st Annual American School Health Association Conference, July 9 - 13, 2007, will be held at the Ala Moana Hotel in Honolulu, Hawaii. The theme for the conference is, "Health Literacy in Many Cultures."

Health literacy, a public health priority, encompasses the cognitive and social skills that enable people to gain access to, understand, and use information to make informed choices. Many of the conference sessions will relate to improving health literacy individually, in the classroom or within groups while maintaining an emphasis on coordinated school health.
