A Summer Away From Chico

I spent the entire summer in Washington, DC and the Caribbean working with the Healthy Settings Unit, Area of Sustainable Development and Environmental Health, Pan American Health Organization (PAHO). The Healthy Municipalities and Communities strategy was introduced into the English-speaking Caribbean countries of Belize, Guyana, Suriname, and Trinidad and Tobago. A Consultation was held June 8-10, 2004, in Port of Spain, Trinidad. Also attending the consultation were representatives from the PAHO countries offices, headquarters, and the Caribbean Programme Coordination Office (CPC) in Bridgetown, Barbados (covers the East Indies). In addition, the California State University, Chico, Department of Health and Community Services, the University of West Indies (Mona Campus, Jamaica), and the University of Guyana were represented.

Knowledge sharing and networking between country representatives took place. There were several technology-related outcomes of the consultation that must be noted here. Several needs were identified: 1) a web-based distance learning program to train health promotion workers and other community-based professionals to build capacity of the workforce; 2) a web-based Caribbean Clearinghouse for health promotion-related information from English-speaking countries to make accessing the information easy; and 3) an electronic mailing list to facilitate inter-country communication between health promotion professionals in the sub-region.

Marilyn Rice and I will be making a presentation about health promotion initiatives and problems practitioners face in English-speaking Caribbean countries at the SOPHE Annual Meeting in Washington, DC, November 5-7, 2004.
